WIFI WORKSHOPS CREATION

The third output of the project consists on the design of the WIFI workshops, which take into account a set of basic key competences to be acquired by the target group:

- Information and knowledge management.
- Problem solving and reasoning.
- Management and organisation of activities.
- Cooperation and promotion of collaboration/teamwork.
- Management of mathematical and budgetary information.
- Use of oral communication.
- Consideration of social and cultural norms.
- Use of digital resources.
- Development of reading skills.
- Use of written communication.
- Construction of one's own professional career.

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- WIFI Workshops creation
- Transnational training
- Transnational meeting





The workshops are divided into four areas: cooking, small wooden constructions, gardening, and art.

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Methodology

The model contains manual and everyday activities. The idea is that, by carrying them out, the target group will improve their skills and competences in order to overcome the obstacles created by illiteracy. The activities pursue the same objectives in each area, but the materials have been adapted.

The aim is to give them a first work and team experience accessible to their level, to enable them to work on their initial skills through experience and develop them to access vocational training or qualifications later on. This will increase their chances of integration and, in time, enable them to access a job placement company, a training course leading to a qualification in order to start a basic training process or even to enter directly into the labour market.

We will soon conduct a piloting with 12 illiterate people for 90 hours divided in 4-hour long sessions, and the course will contain 24 units.

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TRANSNATIONAL TRAINING

A transnational training of trainers took place in **Turin** (Italy) on **24 and 25 January**.

Two trainers from each of WIFI's partner organisations attended.

The main objective of the training was to lay the groundwork for the piloting that will start soon in the 5 participating countries: France, Spain, Italy, Austria, and Sweden.

The trainers had the opportunity to experience first-hand some of the activities proposed in the WIFI Workshops, as well as to learn about the methodology of the workshops, and the particularities of the target group they will start working with soon. In addition, they were able to exchange experiences and share some examples of good practices in this field.



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TRANSNATIONAL MEETING

A new transnational meeting between the partner organisations of the project was also held in **Turin** on **24** and **25** January.

The WIFI project managers evaluated the final version of two of the project outcomes:

- Explanatory map of competences.
- WIFI workshops for the acquisition of competences.

In addition, preparations began for the future piloting of the tools developed within the framework of the project. The work done so far was evaluated and the next steps to be taken to achieve the objectives set were defined. Topics such as the dissemination of **WIFI**, as well as future work on the sustainability of the project over time were also discussed.
