MaMuMi "Mapping the Music of Migration" is a two-year pan-European, Erasmus+ musical inheritance project focused on about talking music and song as a tool for intercultural competency. lt has 7 partners in Bulgaria, Cyprus, Greece, Italy, Norway, Spain and the UK and involves the collection, editing and uploading of "Song Stories", stories about music to an interactive app. stories These focus on "inheritance tracks"; the songs or music that migrants have inherited, the discussion of which acts as a platform for diversity awareness in dedicated MaMuMi "Song Worlds" workshops'.
